This course provides a survey of the organizational, legal, political, and social issues that surround the creation, dissemination and use of big data from the perspective of social and organizational informatics.

It is designed to provide students with an understanding of the ways in which the integration of big data is changing organizational structure, culture, and work practices. The goal of the course is to help students understand the complexity of the organizational, legal, political, and social issues that surround the creation, dissemination and use of big data. Students will have the opportunity to develop their decision making skills working with big data in group contexts over the course of the semester.
